Sanborn was a publisher who went to live in Concord in the 1850s. He lodged with the Thoreau family for a time and thus was sometimes privy to family life in the Thoreau household. In this biography, Sanborn combines anecdotes from Channing's biography ("Thoreau: The Poet Naturalist") with information from letters and family documents, excerpts from Thoreau's Journal, as well as his own first-hand knowledge of the Thoreaus to paint a picture of the life of Henry David Thoreau. This biography is much more cohesive than Channing's, however, in his efforts to explain as much of Thoreau's context in place and time as possible, Sanborn occasionally strays off-topic, providing detailed descriptions of characters who lived in Concord around the same time as Thoreau, without explaining how close their relations with Thoreau actually were. Sanborn includes much interesting biographical detail drawn from letters, but since this material was unpublished, it is hard to check its veracity. Indeed, later reviewers of Sanborn's work such as Harding ("A Thoreau Handbook") have noted that Sanborn was notorious for changing texts to suit his own tastes or purposes. Although this biography was the first biography of Thoreau written in a style somewhat similar to that expected by modern academic readers, Sanborn provides no footnotes or other references to primary sources. Thus, readers of this biography need to keep in mind that any information they find in this volume may not be completely reliable. Nevertheless, the book provides a very readable overview of Thoreau's life as seen by someone who knew him well and had a great respect for his writing.
